





INTRODUCTION

It is extraordinary to observe the processes used by God in the formation of his people. When the children of Israel entered Egypt they were a handful of people, seventy to be exact. Logic said that they should've been assimilated by the country, seventy people, surrounded by thousands, but it was not so, the lessons learned, taught and repeated from parents to children and engraved in the heart by divine providence, allowed Israel to become a nation with characteristics of its own, in the midst of another.


Like the great rivers that penetrate and follow its course through them, Israel maintained its identity in the midst of the Egyptians.





Salatica 1) PLAGUES

Exodus chapters 7 - 12.







By sending the plagues to Pharaoh, God showed that He was God above all things.

Pharaoh felt powerful and trusted his gods. The plagues went directly against the Egyptian deities (Ex. 12:12), thus showing God's complete control over them.

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theat 1) PLAGUES

Exodus chapters 7 - 12.

1) THE PLAGUE OF BLOOD, confronted HAPI the god of flooding (Ex.7: 14-24)

2) THE PLAGUE OF FROGS, challenged HAPI and EST, stream gods, PTHA, frog-headed god and frog goddess EKA (Ex.8:1-15)

3) THE PLAGUE OF LICE, went against LEV, god of earth and dust (Ex.8:16-19)

4) THE PLAGUE OF FLIES, challenged PHARA, god of flies (Ex.8:20-32)

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theat 1) PLAGUES

Exodus chapters 7 - 12.

5) THE PLAGUE OF CATTLE DEATH, confronted APIS, bull god, cattle god and AMON, the god of ram (Ex.9: 1-7)

6) THE PLAGA OF ULCERS, challenged NEIT, queen of heaven (Ex.9:8-12)

7) THE HAIL PLAGUE, went against IRIS, goddess of rain and OSIRIS, god of fire (Ex.9:13-35)

8) THE PLAGUE OF LOCUSTS, challenged ISIS, a goddess who protected locusts and SERAFIS, god protector of locusts, SEVET, god of insects and SHU, god of air (Ex.10:1-20)

9) THE PLAGUE OF DARKNESS, confronted RA, god of the sun (Ex.10:21-29)

10) THE DEATH OF FIRSTBORNS, challenged Pharaoh himself who considered him the son of the SUN god (Ex.11:1-12:33)



The New Testament mentions several Passover celebrations Jesus attended (Lk 2:42,43; Jn. 2:13), and especially the last one for Him, in the upper chamber, on the night of the eve of his death (Matthew 26:17-30; Mr. 14:12-16; Lk 22:7-23; Jn.13)

Today the Jews still celebrate Passover, with unleavened breads, bitter herbs and other things, but without the slaughter of a lamb.



Salática 2) PASSOVER

Exodus 12:1-28.

Paul says: "... our Passover, which is Christ, was already sacrificed by us" (1 Co.5:7). According to the New Testament Christ meets the conditions of the Sacrificial Lamb; He is the lamb of God, slain by our voluntary freedom "henceforth before the foundation of the world" (1 P. 1:18-20); He was found spotless (He. 9:14); volunteered (Jn. 10:17,18; Acts 8:32-35); his bones weren't broken (Jn.19:36)


Unleavened breads symbolize the moral cleansing Christians should seek when sitting at the Lord's table (1 Co. 5:7,8). Jesus using the elements of bread and wine established for Christians the Lord's Supper, which is the holiday corresponding to the Jewish Passover.

This supper today commemorates the death of Christ on the cross, where by which we are free and saved by faith (1 Co. 11:23-30)



filea 3) THE LAW

The two stone boards containing the Decalogue were kept within the ark of the covenant for centuries.



Therefore, the tabernacle was called "the tent of testimony," to remind the Israelites that within the ark was the law and that they should live according to it.

The order of appearance is very appropriate, only those who love God can truly love their neighbor
